Having considered the aforementioned complaint, introduced pursuant to Council Join Action 2008/124/CFSP of 4 February 2008, the EULEX Accountability Concept of 29 October 2009 on the establishment of the Human Rights Review Panel and the Rules of Procedure of the Panel adopted on 9 June 2010,

Having deliberated, decides as follows:

I. PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE PANEL

 The complaint was registered on 13 July 2010. On the same date the Secretariat informed the complainant of the receipt of the complaint and forwarded the complaint to the Human Resources' Personnel Officer of EULEX Kosovo for information.

II. THE FACTS

2. The complainant applied for a position as Legal Adviser with EULEX in Prizren Region on two occasions. Although interviewed, she was not selected. During her second interview she was subjected to a test of the English language. She later found out that participating in such test was only required in Prizren Region, and not, for example, in Prishtinë/Priština Region.

III. COMPLAINT

- 3. The complainant claims that she was discriminated against in the recruitment procedure.
- 4. She submits that the recruitment standards throughout EULEX Kosovo mission should be coordinated to ensure that interviews and testing for comparable positions ought to be the same regardless of the geographical location.

IV. THE LAW

- 5. Before considering the complaint on its merits the Panel has to decide whether to accept the complaint, taking into account the admissibility criteria set out in Rule 29 of its Rules of Procedure.
- 6. According to Rule 25, paragraph 1 of the Rules of Procedure the Panel can examine complaints relating to the human rights violations by EULEX Kosovo in the conduct of its executive mandate.
- 7. The issue raised in the present complaint relates to recruitment procedures in EULEX Kosovo and therefore it does not fall within the ambit of the executive mandate of EULEX Kosovo, the latter being confined to certain matters pertaining to justice, police and customs.

FOR THESE REASONS,

The Panel, unanimously, holds that it lacks competence to examine the complaint, finds the complaint manifestly ill-founded within the meaning of Article 29 (d) of its Rules of Procedure, and

DECLARES THE COMPLAINT INADMISSIBLE.
